PREFACE

STATE APPROVING AGENCY

Federal Laws and Missouri Statutes authorize the State Board of Education to approve courses for the education of veterans and eligible persons as provided by Chapter 36 and other applicable Chapters under Title 38, United States Code; Chapter 1606, Title 10, United States Code; and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended. The Veterans' Education and Training Section has been designated the State Approving Agency for these purposes.

APPROVAL STANDARDS

Common approval standards for these programs have been developed, approved by the State Board of Education, and registered with the Secretary of State (5 CSR 60-900.050).

The State Standards authorize the approval of courses as "accredited courses" when:

- 1) Such courses are offered at institutions that have been accredited and approved by an accrediting agency or association that is recognized by the United States Department of Education and the State Approving Agency; or
- 2) Credit for the course is approved by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for credit toward a high school diploma; or
- 3) The courses are conducted under Section 11-28 of Title 20, U.S. Code (Vocational Acts); or
- 4) The courses are accepted by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education for credit for a teacher's certificate.

An asterisk (*) after the name of a school or course in this directory indicates approval as an accredited course.

Non-accredited courses may be approved when the courses and the school meet the detailed criteria of Section 3676, Title 38, U.S. Code, and 5 CSR 60-900.050.

THE NONCONTRIBUTORY G.I. BILL- CHAPTER 34

The noncontributory G.I. Bill ended on December 31, 1989. No benefits are payable under the noncontributory G.I. Bill for any training pursued on or after January 1, 1990. It is possible, however, for some individuals who signed up for active duty by December 31, 1976, had no break in service, and continued on active duty for at least three (3) years after June 30, 1985, may be eligible for benefits under the old G.I. Bill (Chapter 34) crossover into the Montgomery G.I. Bill (Chapter 30) programs.

WIVES, WIDOWS AND CHILDREN OF VETERANS - CHAPTER 35

Wives and children of veterans are eligible for education assistance benefits if the veteran died or became totally disabled as a result of services in the armed forces. Wives and children of American prisoners of war are eligible for similar benefits. The son or daughter of the veteran generally must be between the ages of 18 and 26.

THE VETERANS' EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (VEAP) - CHAPTER 32

The Veterans' Education and Assistance Act of 1975 provides educational and training assistance for persons entering the military service on or after January 1, 1977 and before July 1, 1985. Any individual on active duty in the armed forces who was eligible to enroll in VEAP on June 30, 1985, was allowed to enroll in this program prior to April 1, 1987. Benefits were accumulated by including contributions from the participating serviceperson and a matching fund from Department of Veterans Affairs at the rate of \$2 for each \$1 contributed by the participant. This act was amended to provide educational assistance benefits for apprenticeship and other on-the-job training, correspondence courses, and flight training.

MONTGOMERY G.I. BILL - CHAPTER 30, CHAPTER 1606, and CHAPTER 1607

The Montgomery G.I. Bill provides educational assistance for persons entering military services after June 30, 1985. This G.I. Bill consists of two components--the program of educational assistance for active duty service personnel (Chapter 30, Title 38, U.S. Code) and the educational assistance program for members of the Selected Reserve (Chapter 1606, Title 10, U.S. Code).

CHAPTER 30

Eligible persons with three years of service will be entitled to \$1,426.00 per month of education assistance for 36 months - a total of \$51,336.00. For those who initially enlist for two years, the rate is \$1,158.00 per month for 36 months. There will be a reduction of \$100 per month for the first 12 months of basic pay to qualify the participant for these benefits.

Only those persons who have met the requirements of a secondary school diploma (or an equivalency certificate) will be eligible for this educational assistance program. Individuals may satisfy the high school requirement if they successfully complete the equivalent of 12 semester hours in a program leading to a standard college degree.

Eligible persons may qualify for educational assistance, in addition to the basic benefits, commonly called a "Kicker", if directed by the Department of Defense.

Educational assistance benefits are payable for attendance at institutions of higher learning, non-college degree programs, apprenticeship, on-the-job training, correspondence courses, cooperative courses, license and certification test fees, and flight training. Veterans may pursue refresher, remedial and deficiency courses, qualify for tutorial assistance, or receive work-study benefits.

CHAPTER 1606

Educational assistance is also provided for persons who enlist, reenlist, or extend an enlistment for service in the Selected Reserve for a period of not less than six years. They are entitled to \$337.00 per month of education assistance for 36 months - a total of \$12,132.00. No reduction in pay is required under this program.

Educational assistance is payable for the pursuit of an undergraduate degree, non-college degree program, apprenticeship, on-the-job training, correspondence courses, cooperative courses, license and certification test fees, and flight training. Reservists may receive work-study benefits for services performed at approved facilities.

A reservist who fails to participate satisfactorily in the Selected Reserve is no longer eligible for educational assistance and may be required to repay a portion of the educational benefits received.

Chapter 1607

Chapter 1607 provides educational assistance to members of the reserve components called or ordered to active duty in response to a war or national emergency as declared by the President or Congress. It is retroactive to September 11, 2001 and 90 days after that date is the earliest effective date possible.

If you have previously drawn education or training benefits under Chapter 1606, you may be eligible to convert those benefits to Chapter 1607. The VA must verify eligibility, re-enter the previous awards and then you will be paid retroactively the difference between Chapter 1606 and Chapter 1607. Benefit rates for Chapter 1607 are \$570.40 to \$1,140.80 per month depending on eligibility.

INFORMATION

School administrators may obtain information regarding the approval of courses for the education of veterans and eligible persons by contacting the Director of Veterans' Education.

Veterans and eligible persons may obtain information or may apply for educational benefits by contacting their local Veterans' Services officer or the nearest Department of Veterans Affairs office.

This directory lists the names of institutions in Missouri that offer approved courses. The listing does not imply that all courses offered by the institutions are approved. The prospective student is urged to write or visit the school for specific information relative to courses, entrance requirements and costs.

IMPORTANT NOTE: A standard term is considered to be 10 to 13 weeks long for a quarter and 15 to 19 weeks long for a semester. Training time for courses that are offered for a shorter or longer period (non standard term) is determined by using a training time equivalency table.

Post-9/11 GI Bill: General Information

Who is eligible for benefits under the Post-9/11 GI Bill?

Individuals who serve at least 90 days of aggregate service after September 10, 2001 are eligible.

To be eligible for 100% of the benefit, an individual must have served an aggregate of 36 months of active duty service, or have been discharged for a service-connected disability after 30 days of continuous service. **NOTE:** Active-duty service time required by graduates of a Service Academy or ROTC does **not** count toward the three years necessary to qualify for full benefits.

For those who served fewer than 36 months, the percentage of benefit ranges from 40% to 90%:

- 90% - 30 total months (including service on active duty in entry level and skill training)
- 80% - 24 total months (including service on active duty in entry level and skill training)
- 70% - 18 total months (**excluding** service on active duty in entry level and skill training)
- 60% - 12 total months (**excluding** service on active duty in entry level and skill training)
- 50% - 6 total months (**excluding** service on active duty in entry level and skill training)
- 40% - 90 or more days (**excluding** service on active duty in entry level and skill training).

For example, an individual with five months of qualifying service could receive 40% of the tuition benefit, 40% of the monthly housing allowance, and a maximum of \$400 books and supplies stipend.

Veterans must have an honorable discharge or other qualifying discharge (e.g. hardship, condition interfering with duty, etc.) to be eligible.

What benefits do students receive under the Post-9/11 GI Bill?

Depending on each individual's situation, benefits could include payment of tuition and fees, a monthly housing allowance, a stipend for books and supplies, college fund ("kicker") payments, a rural benefit payment, and a Yellow Ribbon benefit. Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits differ from other education assistance programs in that each type of payment is issued separately, with some payments made directly to the school and others issued to the individual.

Tuition and Fees: These payments are issued to the school on behalf of the individual at the time the certificate of enrollment is processed

- **Not on active duty:** For individuals not on active duty, the amount is prorated according to length of service. The amount paid is limited to the highest amount of tuition and fees charged for full-time, undergraduate training at a public institution of higher learning in the state where the student is enrolled. (*A chart of maximum in-state tuition and fees for 2008-2009 is on the VA GI Bill website at http://www.gibill.va.gov/GI_Bill_Info/CH33/Tuition_and_fees.htm.*)

- **On active duty:** Individuals on active duty may receive the total amount of tuition and fees. The amount is not limited to the state maximum.

Monthly housing allowance: This payment is issued directly to the student at the beginning of each month for education and training pursued the previous month. The amount is prorated based on length of service. **NOTE:** Active duty personnel are **not** eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill monthly housing allowance. Students enrolled exclusively in online training are not eligible for the housing allowance.

Books and supplies stipend: This payment issued directly to the student when the school certifies and VA processes the enrollment. This benefit is prorated based on length of service. **NOTE:** Active duty personnel are **not** eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill books and supplies stipend.

Yellow Ribbon payments: The Yellow Ribbon Program allows degree-granting institutions to enter into a voluntary agreement with VA to fund tuition expenses that exceed the highest public in-state undergraduate tuition rate for individuals eligible for the 100% payment tier. The institution can contribute up to 50% of those expenses and VA will match the same amount as the institution. This payment is issued to the school when the school certifies and VA processes the student's enrollment. (*For details on this program see **Yellow Ribbon Program** on the web page — http://www.gibill.va.gov/GI_Bill_Info/CH33/Yellow_ribbon.htm.)*

College fund or “kicker”: These payments are issued directly to the student based on “rate of pursuit” (full- or part-time study) and the education benefits program under which the kicker is payable. Post-9/11 GI Bill kickers will be issued monthly with the housing allowance; all other kickers will be issued in a lump sum when the student's enrollment certification is processed.

Rural benefit payments: This one-time, lump-sum payment of \$500 is issued directly to a student who resides in a county with six persons or fewer per square mile (as determined by the most recent decennial census), and who either:

- physically relocates at least 500 miles to attend an educational institution, *or*
- relocates by air (any distance) to physically attend an educational institution, if no other land-based transportation exists.

What kind of education and training does the Post-9/11 GI Bill cover?

Approved training under the Post-9/11 GI Bill includes graduate and undergraduate degrees. All training programs must be offered by a degree-granting institution of higher learning (IHL) and approved for GI Bill benefits. Additionally, tutorial assistance and reimbursement for one licensing or certification test reimbursement are available under the Post- 9/11 GI Bill.

NOTE: If an individual is eligible for the Post 9/11 GI Bill as well as other GI Bill benefits, s/he will be required to make **an irrevocable choice** of which benefit to receive. Individuals who were previously eligible for the Montgomery GI Bill-Active Duty (MGIB-AD, Chapter 30), Montgomery GI Bill-Selected Reserve (MGIB-SR, Chapter 1606), or the Reserve Educational Assistance Program (REAP, Chapter 1607) may continue to receive benefits for approved programs not offered by degree-granting institutions. These programs include flight, correspondence, apprenticeship/on-the-job training, preparatory courses, and national tests. Individuals in these programs will be paid as if they are still receiving benefits under Chapters 30, 1606, and 1607.

When will benefits be paid?

The Post-9/11 GI Bill is effective for training on or after August 1, 2009.

What is the eligibility period?

The period of eligibility for the Post 9/11 GI Bill ends 15 years from the date of the last discharge or release from active duty of at least:

90 consecutive days

30 days but less than 90 days if released for a service-connected disability

Or: 15 years from the date of discharge for the last period of service used to meet the minimum service requirements of 90 aggregate days of service.

Upcoming Changes to The Post-9/11 GI-Bill

The Post-9/11 Veterans Education Assistance Improvements Act of 2010 was recently signed into law. This page lists changes to the GI Bill made by this law.

Effective August 1, 2009, but not payable until October 1, 2011

- Expands the Post-9/11 GI Bill to include Active Service performed by National Guard members under title 32 U.S.C. for the purpose of organizing, administering, recruiting, instructing, or training the National Guard; or under section 502(f) for the purpose of responding to a national emergency.

Effective March 5, 2011

- Limits active duty members to the net cost for tuition and fees prorated based on the eligibility tiers (40%-100%) previously established for Veterans.
 - Same limitations apply to transferee spouses of active duty servicemembers

Effective August 1, 2011

- For Veterans and their transferees - simplifies the tuition and fee rates for those attending a public school and creates a national maximum for those enrolled in a private or foreign school
 - Pays all public school in-state tuition and fees;
 - Private and foreign school costs are capped at \$17,500 annually;
 - The Yellow Ribbon Program still exists for out-of-state fees and costs above the cap.
- For Active Duty Members and their transferees - creates a national rate for those active duty members enrolled in a private or foreign school pursuing a degree
 - Pays all public school in-state tuition and fees;
 - Private and foreign school costs are capped at \$17,500 annually
- Allows VA to pay MGIB (chapter 30) and MGIB-SR (chapter 1606) 'kickers', or college fund payments, on a monthly basis instead of a lump sum at the beginning of the term
- Prorates housing allowance by the student's rate of pursuit (rounded to the nearest tenth)
 - A student training at a rate of pursuit of 75% would receive 80% of the BAH rate
- Break or interval pay is no longer payable under **any** VA education benefit program unless under an Executive Order of the President or due to an emergency, such as a natural disaster or strike.
 - This means that when your semester ends (e.g. December 15th), your housing allowance is paid for the first 15 days of December only and begins again when your next semester begins (e.g. January 10th) and is paid for the remaining days of January.
 - Students using other VA education programs are included in this change. Monthly benefits will be pro-rated in the same manner.
 - Entitlement that previously would have been used for break pay will be available for use during a future enrollment.
- Allows reimbursement for more than one "license or certification" test (previously only one test was allowed).
 - However, entitlement is now charged
- Allows reimbursement of fees paid to take national exams used for admission to an institution of higher learning (e.g., SAT, ACT, GMAT, LSAT)
- Allows those who are eligible for both Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (chapter 31) benefits and Post-9/11 GI Bill (chapter 33) benefits to choose the Post-9/11 GI Bill's monthly housing allowance instead of the chapter 31 subsistence allowance.

- NOAA and PHS personnel are now eligible to transfer their entitlement to eligible dependents

Effective October 1, 2011

- Allows students to use the Post-9/11 GI Bill for -
 - Non-college degree (NCD) programs: Pays actual net cost for in-State tuition and fees at public NCD institutions. At private and foreign institutions, pays the actual net costs for in-state tuition and fees or \$17,500, whichever is less. Also pays up to \$83 per month for books and supplies.
 - On-the-job and apprenticeship training: Pays a monthly benefit amount prorated based on time in program and up to \$83 per month for books and supplies.
 - Flight programs: Per academic year, pays the actual net costs for in-state tuition and fees assessed by the school or \$10,000, whichever is less.
 - Correspondence training: Per academic year, pays the actual net costs for in-state tuition and fees assessed by the school or \$8,500, whichever is less.
- Housing allowance is now payable to students (other than those on active duty) enrolled solely in distance learning. The housing allowance payable is equal to ½ the national average BAH for an E-5 with dependents.
 - The full-time rate for an individual eligible at the 100% eligibility tier would be \$673.50 for 2011.
- Allows students on active duty to receive a books and supplies stipend.

GI Bill Transferability Has Arrived

For the first time in history, servicemembers enrolled in the Post-9/11 GI Bill program will be able to transfer unused educational benefits to their spouses or children starting Aug. 1, 2009. New Department of Defense guidance, issued June 23, 2009, establishes the criteria for eligibility and transfer of those education benefits. The new GI Bill, signed into law June 20, 2008, provides the most comprehensive educational benefit package since the original bill, officially known as the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944, was signed into law. INCREASE IN EDUCATION ASSISTANCE FOR SERVICE PERSONS

The Floyd D. Spence National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2001 (Public Law 106-398), which was signed into law by the President on October 30, 2000, gives many members of the Armed Forces a chance to receive increased payment for off-duty training and education.

- **Before this law**—the military services in most cases could pay up to 75% of the tuition or expenses charged by the school. This program is known as Tuition Assistance. Eligible service members had to find additional financing, or pay the remaining expenses, from their own pockets. A service member eligible for the Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB), a VA education benefit, wasn't allowed to receive both Tuition Assistance and the MGIB for the same course.
- **Now, with this law**—the military services can pay up to 100% of the tuition and expenses charged by the school. If a service department pays less than 100%, a service member eligible for MGIB can elect to receive MGIB benefits for all or a part of the remaining expenses.

A service member who receives MGIB benefits as a result of the provision will receive a lower rate once he or she is discharged. The full-time monthly rate will be the rate that would have been payable to him or her had he or she not used the MGIB in service for tuition assistance, reduced by the amount of payments received in service, divided by 36.

Example: The total amount of tuition assistance used by the veteran during his or her military career was \$1,950. If he or she had not used MGIB in service for tuition assistance, he or she would have 36 months at \$650 remaining, or \$23,400. His or her new monthly rate for full-time training as a discharged veteran will be \$23,400 minus \$1,950 divided by 36, or \$595.83 for 36 months.
